What do we mean by Curriculum?


The curriculum is everything that we teach children whilst they are at our school.



Our curriculum offer ensures both breadth and balance when studying subject from the National Curriculum.

The curriculum at Preston Primary is sequenced to ensure prior learning is recapped and built upon so that children leave at the end of Key Stage 2 with secure knowledge within any given subject.

At the heart of our curriculum lie our values which provide children with essential life skills. These include Respect, Responsibility, Teamwork, Independence, Creativity and Determination.



Most importantly, our curriculum is inspiring, challenging and prepares children for their future life.



Sequenced Learning

Learning is carefully sequenced to ensure purposeful and well organised knowledge is taught and understood.

Children in Key Stage 1 and 2 will enjoy a long and short enquiry each half term.

Long Enquiries

A long enquiry typically lasts 5 weeks and allows us to teach a subject, such as history, in depth. Clear expectations of what will be learned, is shared with parents and pupils through a Knowledge Organiser. We use technology to check children's learning and track their progress.

Short Enquiries

A short enquiry can last anything from 1 – 3 days and adds breadth to our curriculum.





Our aims are to create a love of learning for all our pupils, guide them to understand what it means to be a positive citizen in society, and to prepare them for a world of work that could be very different to today.
