There is no greater gift at Christmas than the gift of a book. While Santa is busy reading your lists, I wonder what you will be reading this Christmas?




#### Mrs Bastin


# Class recommendation: Woodpeckers and Sparrows






# Mr Mealy

We like the way the author Matt Haig describes the scenes. You can really imagine being there. You never know what will happen next!




#### Class recommendation: Puffins and Penguins
