## The Powerful Knowledge we will take away from this Learning Enquiry (what children will be learning):

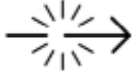
Making sense of beliefs



Children will discuss and recognise the word 'Salvation', and that Christians believe Jesus came to 'save' or 'rescue' people, e.g., by showing them how to live.

They will be encouraged to offer informed suggestions about what the events of Holy Week mean to Christians. Children will discuss and give examples of what Christians say about the importance of the events of Holy Week.

Understanding the impact



Children will make simple links between the Gospel accounts and how Christians mark the Easter events in their communities. We will discuss and describe how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus in worship in different ways.

Making connections



Connecting

Through discussion we will raise thoughtful questions and suggest some answers about why Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday', giving good reasons for their suggestions.

Christian, 'Good Friday', Died, Easter Sunday, Heaven, Salvation, Holy Week, Easter, Save, Sin.

## Our Key Vocabulary:

Word	Meaning
Jesus	The Son of God.
Christian	A person who believes in God, Jesus, and the teachings of the Bible.
Good Friday	The Friday before Easter Sunday, on which Christ was crucified.
Died	To stop living.
Easter Sunday	The Sunday in Holy week that remember the crucifixion of Jesus.
Heaven	The place where God lives.
Salvation/save	The act of human souls being saved from eternal punishment and being allowed to enter the Kingdom of Heaven.
Worship	To honour God.
Holy Week	The week remembers the final days of Jesus' life, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday.
Easter	A Christian holiday celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.
Sin	An offence against moral or religious laws.

What I already know:

In Unit 2, Cycle A, children will have learned about the importance of Easter to Christians. Then, in Unit 3, Cycle A, the children will have learned about Pentecost and will have been introduced as to why Jesus died. This will extend children's learning, thinking about why Christians believe Good Friday is called this (as Jesus gave up his life for his people and then came back on Easter- proving he was indeed the son of God).

Holy Week is celebrated by Christians across the world and remembers the final days of Jesus' life, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday.



Good Friday is the Friday before Easter Sunday. It is important as it commemorates the day on which Christ was crucified.
