Word	Meaning
10 commandments	A set of rules passed to Moses from God.
Sukkot	A Jewish festival of harvest.
Synagogue	A Jewish holy building, where Jews gather for worship.
Torah	The Jewish Holy text.
Siddur	The main prayer book in the Synagogue
Bimah	A raised platform where most of the services take place in a Synagogue.
Ark	A cupboard where the Torah scrolls are kept in a Synagogue
The Eternal Light	Hangs about the Ark in a Synagogue, reminding Jews that God is always with them.
Rabbi	A Jewish religious leader.
Kippah	A rimless hat worn by Jewish males as a sign of respect.

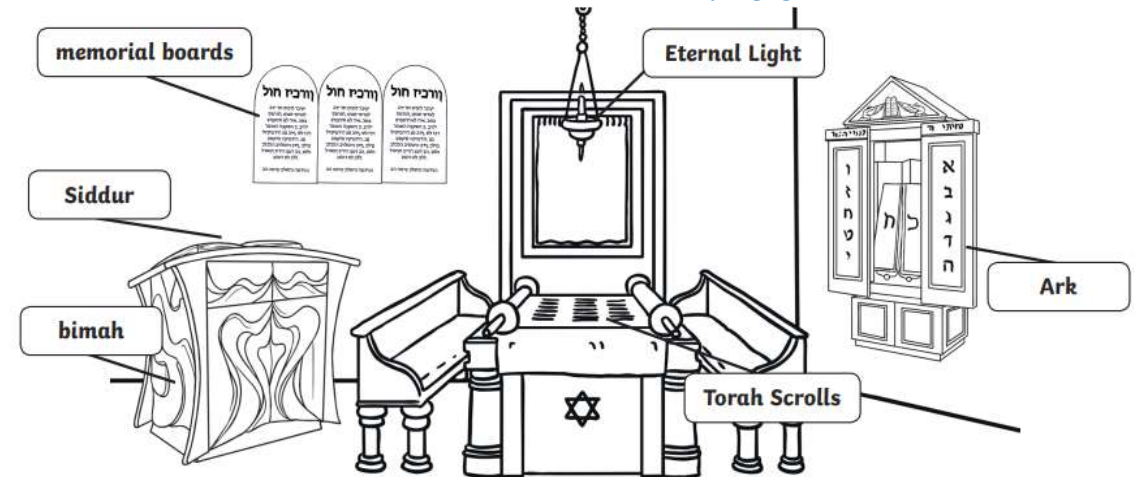

Sukkot is a Jewish festival of harvest, during which a temporary hut, called a Sukkah, is built. This is often topped with branches and Jews will eat and sleep in it during Sukkot. This symbolizes the time the Israelites spent in the wilderness after they were freed from slavery in Egypt.

These are the main features of a Synagogue.



The story of David and Goliath is a key story from the Torah, and teaches Jews about how God wants them to live.



The 10 commandments are the set of rules set that God gave to Moses.



A Kippah is a rimless hat worn by Jewish men as a sign of respect.
