Topic: RE – How should we care for others and the world, and why does it matter?

Term: Summer 2

Year: 1 and 2

Duration: 6 weeks

This half term, our focus is to answer the question 'How should we care for others and the world?'

What I already know:

Children will already know:

- Christianity as part of a growing sense of self, their own community, and their place within it.
- Some religious stories making connections with personal experiences.
- That Christians believe in God.
- Will understand Jewish ideas about God.
- Will recognise and know the meaning of some Jewish items, just as the Mezuzah and the menorah.

The Powerful Knowledge we will take away from this Learning Enquiry (what will be learning):



Making sense of belief Identify a story or text that

says something about each person being unique and valuable.

Give an example of a key belief some people find in one of these stories (e.g., that God loves all people)

• Give a clear, simple account of what Genesis 1 tells Christians and Jews about the natural world.



Understanding the impact.

Give an example of how people show that they care for others (e.g., by giving to charity), making a link to one of the stories.

- Give examples of how Christians and Jews can show care for the natural earth
- Say why Christians and Jews might look after the natural world

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Connecting

Think, talk and ask questions about what difference believing in God makes to how people treat each other and the natural world.

Focus for the unit:

How do Christians and Jews know God values everyone?

What are the benefits and responsibilities of friendship and caring for others?

Explore stories from the Bible about friendship and show ideas of good and bad, right and wrong.

Why might serving and supporting others be important to a religious believer?

How can the Golden Rule make life better for everyone?

How does Genesis (God's creation) tell Christians and Jews they have a role in looking after the world?

Investigate ways people can look after the world.

The creation account in Genesis is shared by followers of both the Christian and Jewish faiths. Some people believe this is an accurate description of how the world began but many Christian people see the story as a symbol or parable.



The Golden Rule

All religions have a Golden Rule which they all follow - kindness.

Judaism: What is hateful to you, do not do to your neighbour.

Islam: Not one of you truly believes until you wish for others what you wish for yourself.

Christianity: In everything, do to others as you would have them do to you.

Choices

We make the choice to be kind to others and to treat others the way we would like to be treated ourselves.
