
## The Little Red Hen

At Preston Primary we foster a love of reading. We have been re-telling the story of 'The Little Red Hen' – the children have loved joining in with the actions and the repeated phrases. The children have used their knowledge of the phonic sounds to start writing key words from the story, e.g., hen, cat, red. The 'Little Red Hen' inspired the children to write their own recipes and bake their own 'bread' during choosing learning time in the mud kitchen and on the playdough table. We even made our own bread just like The Little Red Hen. However, unlike the lazy dog, sleepy cat, and noisy duck, we helped each other make the bread. We used the vocabulary: dough, knead, stretch, rise, roll and mix. We learnt that yeast is the special ingredient which helps the bread to rise. The children enjoyed using the timers to measure how long we had to wait for the dough to rise. We hope you enjoyed sharing your bread at home.



## **Maths**

This week we have been focusing on the number 3. We looked closely at Numberblock 3 and noticed all of the things that were '3' about her, e.g., 3 buttons, 3 points to the crown. We noticed that her crown was made from 3 triangles, and we talked about how triangles have got 3 sides and 3 points. We also discussed words that begin with 'tri' such as triangle, triceratops and tricycle and we found out what the 3 part was in these items. We discussed how Numberblock 3 could organise herself into different arrangements, e.g., 3 vertically, 3 horizontally, or a 2 part with a 1 part on top.



### Reading for Pleasure – Mystery Reader

This week the children were treated to a story read by Mrs Coombe. She read 'The book with no pictures' by B.J. Novak. The children all found it very funny when Mrs Coombe had to read ALL of the silly words in the book – because that is the rule, after all!

#### **Environmental area**

At school, we have an area where we can grow vegetables and flowers, including a polytunnel and vegetable beds. This week we visited the space to look closely at the giant sunflowers which are now starting to die off. We talked about how just one sunflower actually gives us hundreds of seeds. We collected some of the sunflower seeds which had fallen to the ground. We will be using this area throughout the year, and in the Spring we will be planting our own seeds.
