
Word	Meaning	
Secular	not connected with religious or spiritual matters.	
Religious	relating to a religion.	
Good News	In Christianity , the gospel, or the Good News , is the news of the imminent coming of the Kingdom of God	
Advent	the first season of the Church year, leading up to Christmas and including the four preceding Sundays.	
Christingle	A lighted candle symbolizing Christ as the light of the world, held by children at a special Advent service originating in the Moravian Church.	
Christmas	the annual Christian festival celebrating Christ's birth, held on 25 December in the Western Church.	
Nativity	the occasion of a person's birth. a picture, carving, or model representing Jesus Christ's birth.	
Manger	a long trough from which horses or cattle feed.
