<u>Learning Experience – When I Grow Up...</u>



Ready for Work

This half term, our learning experience is 'When I Grow Up'. We will be talking to the children about some of the many opportunities they have in the future workplace. We will be linking the learning to our school aim of 'Ready For Work' and looking closely at how our school values and the 4C's (Communication, Collaboration, Critical Thinking and Creativity) are important future skills.

Today, we welcomed Mr Shepstone into class who talked about his job as a Postman. We were amazed to find out that he delivers around 600 letters a day! We talked about the special clothes that he has to wear; we found out that he wears a high-vis jacket with reflector strips on so that drivers can easily spot him when he is walking near the road.

We found out that Mr Shepstone uses the same school values as the children. He is **responsible** for the mail and in making sure that the post gets delivered to the right person. He is **determined** to deliver all of the post, even in cold or wet weather. We found out that Mr Shepstone is part of a large **team** of people who collect the mail, work in the sorting office, work in Post Offices and deliver the mail. He also told us how he is **independent** because he has to deliver the letters on his round all by himself. Sometimes he has to be **creative** if he is not able to deliver a parcel and he might have to think of a different way to get the parcel to the customer. He uses **respect** by treating the post with care and in being polite to the customers that he meets on his rounds. We talked about how we are learning what each of the school values mean so that we can use them to be good citizens in school, the local community, and in the workplace. Writing

This week the children have been labelling objects in our classroom. They wrote words on sticky notes and then put them next to that item. They labelled some of our toys and pictures, e.g. mat, log. In the bathroom they have written 'tap' and 'hot'. Some children have been writing words with digraphs (special friends) in them, for example on the door they wrote 'push' and 'pull', they also wrote the word 'clock'. The children found it very exciting to walk around the classrooms sticking their labels on different things.



















Reading for Pleasure – Children's Choice



Lego Discovery Programme









We are always looking for ways to innovate our curriculum. The First Lego League Discover programme is an exciting and innovative STEM project (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics), which has been very successful over the past few years.

We will be running the sessions over 10 weeks. Over the course of these lessons, children will think and behave like engineers. They will work in small groups to explore, design, create and evaluate their models. They will be using skills to communicate, problem solve, take risks, and pose questions. This links very well with our school values of Teamwork, Determination and Creativity.

The theme this year is called 'Boomtown Build'. The children will explore concepts in architecture — including accessibility, environmentally friendliness, and durability. They will design buildings for different purposes, that can be used by different people.

Home learning. In preparation for the Lego Discovery programme starting next week, we ask if you could take a walk in the local community to look at some of the different buildings and talk about what they are used for. If possible, take pictures of the buildings and send them via Seesaw or email them to foundation@preston.torbay.sch.uk We will use these images during our sessions.

This week, we had an introductory session where Puffins and Penguins explored the Lego Duplo sets. The children thoroughly enjoyed the session and are excited to do it again next week.

We are committed to improve the oral health and well-being of young children, which is why we are so passionate about the NHS toothbrushing scheme, 'Big Brush Club'. The scheme was previously called the 'Brush Bus' but has recently been redeveloped.

It is essential for children to understand the importance of keeping their teeth clean and becoming more independent. We are pleased to say that we have secured funding for the programme to continue in school this year.

Children in Foundation will brush their teeth after lunch in school. They will be supervised by an adult and have their own toothbrush stored in a rack. They brush their teeth to a special song for 2 minutes. All staff follow the NHS guidelines and are trained by the programme facilitators.
