PE

For the last couple of weeks, we have been developing accuracy when throwing to a target. We had a rotation of activities in the hall using bean bags and tennis balls. Each activity required us to work in a group, take turns and improve our aim and accuracy to hit the target or roll the ball under an arch. We used the archery boards to practise throwing beanbags at the bullseye using an overarm throw. It was noticeable how the children's accuracy has improved already!













Lunar New Year

As part of the Chinese New Year celebration, the dragon dance is often performed. This week, the children enjoyed performing their own dragon dance in the school hall. They all had the opportunity to dance with the dragon and play musical instruments. It was wonderful.







The children were also given the chance to taste some traditional Chinese food, including stir-fry noodles, prawn crackers and vegetable spring rolls. The children all enjoyed being adventurous and some even surprised themselves by how tasty it was. They each received a pair of chopsticks and were challenged to use them to eat the delicious food. They amazed us with their ability to pick up the food with their chopsticks, especially as for most of them, this was their first attempt at using them. The children wanted to keep their chopsticks to use at home.













Lego Discovery









In Lego Discovery this week the children recapped their learning from last week and talked about all the different jobs people do on a construction site. They were challenged to build a construction site and recreate the vehicles and tools from last week. We focused on the teamwork skill of listening to one another. They talked about how they could amend and improve their designs from last week. We were very impressed with their ideas and creations.


The adult collecting your child that day will be able to come into the classroom at 2.45pm (via the playground) to share some stories and then you will be able to take the children home at 3.15pm.

At Preston Primary we will be celebrating World Book Day on **Friday 8th March**. It is an annual event and is a wonderful way to promote reading, books, and authors. It is celebrated in over 100 countries around the world!

On the day the children can come to school dressed as a character from a book.

Please don't feel pressure to buy anything especially for this day. Use the dressing up clothes or onesies that you already have. There are so many story books with characters containing pirates, witches, animals, etc. Look at what you already have before buying new.

On the day, we will have an exciting interactive session with a local story teller.

To promote good oral health, yesterday, we were visited by a local Dental Nurse. She spoke to us about how we can look after our teeth and gums.
