Maths

In Year 1 we will be moving on to learning about the place value of numbers up to 40 and then using them to add and subtract. We will then begin to learn about simple multiplication and division problems and simple fractions.

In Year 2 we are going to be continuing learning about measure then moving on to 2D and 3D shapes and money.

School Value



This half term, we are learning about Teamwork by collaborating on our DT projects and learning about taking turns, sharing resources and helping each other to achieve a goal.

British Value



This half term, in our Class Assemblies and PSHE lessons, we are learning about the British Value of Individual Liberty, by understanding how to make healthy choices for ourselves.

Our Curriculum- Children in Key Stage 1 and 2 will enjoy a long and short enquiry each half term.

Long Enquiries

A long enquiry typically lasts five weeks and allows us to teach a subject, such as history, in depth. Clear expectations of what will be learned, is shared with parents and pupils through a Knowledge Organiser. At the end of the work, we plan to use Enquiry Quizzes on our iPads to see how much each child has remembered.

Our first Learning Enquiry this term is **Art—How does Art change over time? We will compare and contrast the art of Van Gogh and Lowry.** The Knowledge Organiser is attached. Please use it to reinforce and repeat the learning at home.

Short Enquiries

A short enquiry lasts four lessons and adds breadth to our curriculum.

Our short enquiry will have a **Design and Technology focus—Structures, How can structures be made stronger, stiffer and more stable?** This will be linked to the story of the Three Little Pigs.
