Our Key Vocabulary:

Word	Meaning
Parable	A simple story which has a special or moral meaning at the end- used as an example showing how to live.
Gospel	A life-story or biography of the life and teaching of Jesus. Gospel comes from the word 'good' and it refers to the 'good news' that Jesus brings.
New Testament	The second part of the Christian bible. It discusses the teachings and person of Jesus.
Teachings	Lessons, usually given through speeches
The Beatitudes	The blessings told by Jesus during his "Sermon on the Mount".
The Sermon on the Mount	A bible story where Jesus explained the Beatitudes.






Matthew 5:9 Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.

Matthew 5:4 Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be


comforted.

The Wise and Foolish Builders:



Two Kinds of People

24 "Everyone who hears these things I say and obeys them is like a wise man. The wise man built his house on rock. 25 It rained hard and the water rose. The winds blew and hit that house. But the house did not fall, because the house was built on rock. 26 But the person who hears the things I teach and does not obey them is like a foolish man. The foolish man built his house on sand. 27 It rained hard, the water rose, and the winds blew and hit that house. And the house fell with a big crash."

This story teaches Christian's that people should listen to Jesus, as he is spreading the word of God: that when we listen to God, we will be saved from disasters as opposed to when we turn away from him and have something that is important be destroyed.

Christian Charity:

Many Christian charities put Jesus' teachings into practice. One charity we will be exploring in lessons is The Leprosy Mission:



This is a Christian charity that helps people with leprosy; a contagious disease that affects the skin.
