#### <u>Learning Experience – Once Upon a Time...</u>

Over the past few weeks, we have been discovering the wonderful world of traditional tales by exploring the following:

- 1. Know some traditional tales and be able to retell the stories through mapping and performance.
- 2. Understand the role of authors and illustrators.
- 3.Understand the structure of a story and common principal characters. Develop confidence in storytelling.
- 4. What are fiction and non-fiction books?

This week the children have been using drama to retell traditional tales. They worked in teams to decide roles, explore vocabulary, and navigate the environment. It has been wonderful to see the children grow in confidence to participate in the activity. It can be a challenge for some children to articulate and project their voice. It is important to give all children the opportunity to explore 'presentational talk'. This is where children must think about the audience they are presenting to and adjust the volume and expression of their voice. We want children to understand that every voice is valued. They had lots of fun retelling the traditional tales.



#### PΕ

Over the past couple of weeks, the children have taken part in two activities. On the field they practiced skills in controlling a ball. They used their hands to push and roll a ball and then had to stop the ball by using different parts of their body. In the hall, the children were practicing the skills of balancing, moving, and climbing. They followed a circuit of apparatus which enabled them to balance and move in different ways. They also climbed over the agility tables demonstrating how they can manage risk and move safely.

We have been very impressed with the children's determination to improve their skills.








### **Maths**

In maths we have been exploring number six. We explored arranging 6 counters in different arrangements, e.g. in a line, in a 6 dice pattern. We then tried to put the counters in a five frame – but we had a problem! There wasn't enough space to fit them all in! This led to lots of discussions around why they couldn't fit all the counters in and how 6 is more than 5. We then realised that we needed a frame with more space, so we switched our five frame for a ten frame. When we placed the counters in this time, the children noticed some things, 'I can see a 5 part and a 1 part', '6 is 1 more than 5', 'I know that it is a 6 because I can subitise the 5 and there is 1 extra.'



## 50th Anniversary of Preston Primary
