Our Curriculum

Children in Key Stage 1 and 2 will enjoy a Long and Short Enquiry each half term.

<u>Long Enquiries:</u> A Long Enquiry typically lasts four weeks and allows us to teach a subject in depth. Clear expectations of what will be learned is shared with parents and pupils through a Knowledge Organiser.

Our Long Enquiry this term is **Music** where we will be exploring how to play the recorder. The Knowledge Organiser for this is attached. Please use it to reinforce and repeat the learning at home.

<u>Short Enquiries</u>: A short enquiry lasts for one to three days and adds breadth to our curriculum.

Our Short Enquiry this half term is **Geography** where we will be exploring the question 'How does plastic pollution impact our planet?'

Maths

This half term in Maths Year 5 are exploring angles, measurement and area and perimeter.

The Year 6 children are looking at graphs and averages, area and perimeter and volume. All the children are going to be using concrete resources, visual images and representations to support them with their learning.

Literacy

This half-term we are going to be exploring 'Harry Potter: The Journey through History of Magic' by British Library. The children will be writing multiple pieces of work about an existing collection of books, such as an informative page and character descriptions.
