## Home Learning and Supporting the Curriculum at home

We have attached a selection of Knowledge Organisers, for you to use to support your child's learning at home. These set out clearly what we expect children to learn and remember in that subject. Please use these at home to reinforce and help embed your child's learning.

Reading—As always, please continue to listen to and read with your child every day.

Home Learning: Make a musical instrument out of recycled materials, explore different genres of music and write about your favourite, listen to a piece and name the instruments, listen to some live music.

## Maths

In Year 1 we will be learning about counting in equal groups and multiplication, then moving on to division and fractions. In Year 2 we are going to finish our block on money, then move on to fractions and measuring temperature.

### Literacy

Our literacy sequence is based on 'Traction Man' by Mini Grey. The children will write an adventure story based on a favourite toy.

Later in the half term we will be reading poem book 'The First Book of the Sea' by Nicola Davies. The children will be writing their own poems.

#### School Value



This half term, we are learning about Creativity. Children will be thinking outside the box to solve problems creatively across all areas of the curriculum.

Creativity is an essential skill for the future, and relates to our School Aim of 'Ready for Work'.

## British Value



This half term, in our Class Assemblies and PSHE lessons, we are learning about the British Value of Tolerance, by understanding about different cultures and accepting opinions of others.

<u>Our Curriculum</u>-Children in Key Stage 1 and 2 will enjoy a long and short enquiry each half term. Long Enquiries

A long enquiry typically lasts five weeks and allows us to teach a subject, such as history, in depth. Clear expectations of what will be learned is shared with parents and pupils through a Knowledge Organiser. At the end of this work, our enquiry will culminate in a performance or outcome for parents, showcasing their acquired skills.

Our first Learning Enquiry this term is **Music**—Throughout this Long Enquiry, children will develop vital musical skills encompassing musicianship, listening, singing, playing, improvising, composing and performing. They will learn about rhythmic patterns, explore diverse pitches, and play and improvise melodies on the Glockenspiel using one, two or three notes. The Knowledge Organiser is attached. Please use it to reinforce and repeat the learning at home.

## **Short Enquiries**

A short enquiry can last anything from 1 – 3 days and adds breadth to our curriculum.

Our short enquiry this term will have a **Geography** focus—fieldwork. To investigate the human and physical features of the school and the grounds.
