We would firstly like to say how incredibly proud we are of all the children. They have been in school for less than six weeks and they have already achieved so much.

This week we have been writing about the story of 'The Little Red Hen' and talking about the characters. The children have been really engaged in the story and keen to share their ideas.

In phonics we have learnt 22 new sounds already. You will find all these sounds in their Read Write Inc booklet. We have been practising our letter formation and recognizing the sounds.

In maths, we have been focusing on numbers 0-5. We have been working in small groups to unpick the numbers and answer challenging questions.

We hope you have a wonderful two week half term, and we look forward to seeing you back in school on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> October.
