


Unit 1 - Puffins and Penguins


Over the next few weeks, we will be taking part in various activities to explore the skills of teamwork. Our new Lego programme is a great example of this.

First Lego League Discover - Playmakers

We are always looking ways to innovate our curriculum and the First Lego League Discover programme is a fun and exciting opportunity. The theme this year is called Playmakers. The children use Duplo and are tasked to design and create a new obstacle course for an outdoor space that can be used by lots of different people in the community. Over the course of 10 sessions, children will think and behave like engineers. The programme will enable children share and test ideas.

Children will be able to work in small groups to explore, design, create and evaluate. They will be using skills to communicate, problem solve, take risks and pose questions.

We want to share the many benefits of the First Lego League Discover programme with you and how the learning can be continued at home. We are starting the programme next week and will keep you updated with our progress. We will be sending out more information in the coming weeks. Home Learning
