
The Powerful Knowledge we will take away from this Learning Enquiry (what children will be learning):













Know that the Viking era lasted between 793 AD – 1066. Know that 1066 was 955 years ago.

Explain that the Vikings were raiders who raided through England, Ireland, France and many other countries. Know that the Vikings traded goods with other nations and often settled in settlements across the countries they travelled to. Know, through evidence-based enquiry, that the Vikings never formed a formal empire as they did not have a single monarch that rules over all Viking settlements.

Know that the Vikings that settled Britain were pagan and worshipped many gods, which was different to the Anglo-Saxons who worshipped one God.

Know that the Vikings raided and settled because Scandinavia lacked natural resources that were treasured during their age (gold and farmland).

Know that the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons both originated from mainland Europe and settled in Britain.

Know that although the Vikings were pagan, many eventually converted to Christianity.

## What I already know:

Children will know other events in history that have taken place: The Great Fire of London and the Roman occupation of Britain.

This is an example of Viking wood carving. The Vikings are known for raiding but they also produced intricate pieces of art that required lots of skill.



The Vikings were famous seafarers and their ships featured the most advanced technologies of the time. Their thin but strong hulls meant they could cross oceans and sail up rivers (making them perfect for raiding).
