
Topic: RE – Who is Muslim and how do they live? Part 2. Term: Spring 1 Year: 1 and 2 Duration: 6 weeks

What I already know:

In the Autumn term, children will have learnt:

- What Muslims believe about Allah and the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH).
- Why the declaration of faith (Shahadah the first pillar of Islam) is so important to Muslims.
- The Islamic festival of Ramadan, where Muslims will fast and give money to charity. This is Sawm -the third pillar of Islam.

The Powerful Knowledge we will take away from this Learning Enquiry (what will be learning):




Word	Meaning
Islam	Islam is the name of the religion that Muslims follow
Muslim	Is a person who believes in Islam.
Prophet	The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) is founder of the Islamic religion.
Muhammad	Muslims believe that Allah sent messages to him which formed their holy book.
(PBUH)	Muslims will say the phrase 'peace be upon him' (PBUH) to show how much they respect and honour him.
Qur'an	The Islamic Holy book. Muslims believe that the words of Allah were sent to
	Muhammad (PBUH), and he wrote them down word for word in the Qur'an.
Allah	The Arabic name that Muslims use for God.
The five Pillars	These are the 5 things that Muslims are expected to do. These are Shahadah (only one
of Islam	God), Salat (prayer), Sawm (fasting), Zakat (charity), and Hajj (pilgrimage).
Shahadah	The declaration of faith: There is no God but Allah, and Muhammad is the messenger of Allah.
Ramadan	Festival where Muslims fast during daylight hours and give money to charity.
Wudu	The ritual of washing before prayer. Muslims believe it is important to be clean before

Salat	One of the 5 pillars of Islam which means prayer.
Најј	One of the 5 pillars of Islam, which means pilgrimage.
Mecca	The Islamic Holy city, where all Muslims try to visit (pilgrimage) within their lives.
Eid Al-Fitr	The festival at the end of Ramadan, where Muslims will celebrate the end of the fasting month with feasts and family visits.
