
The Powerful Knowledge we will take away from this Learning Enquiry (what children will be learning):

Making sense of beliefs

Identify texts that come from the Gospels of Matthew 4 18-22, Mark 1 40-44 and Luke10 25-37, which tells the story of the life and teachings of Jesus.

Clear links will be made between the calling of the first disciples and how Christians today try to follow Jesus and be 'fishers of people'.



What I already know:

Children have explored the in previous years about Easter and how Jesus died at the cross as a sacrifice to human sin. They will know that for Christians, Jesus was the Son of God and that he tried to teach people how to live their lives through the stories of The Bible. It will add to the understandings of how other religions are taught to lead their lives based on the teachings of their sacred texts.

The Bible is the Holy text of Christians. It is comprised of two parts- 'The Old' and 'The New' Testaments. Within 'The New Testament' can be found the Gospels.



The word 'Gospel' literally means 'Good News'. The four Gospels tell of the life and teachings of Jesus, the story of who He is and what He did. These books are called Matthew, Mark, Luke and John because they were traditionally thought to have been written by Matthew, a disciple who was a tax collector; John, the "Beloved Disciple" mentioned in the Fourth Gospel; Mark, the secretary of the disciple Peter; and Luke, the traveling companion of Paul.



These books are the first part of the New Testament of the Bible, and are presented in this order: the Gospel of Matthew, the Gospel of Mark, the Gospel of Luke and the Gospel of John. They give different perspectives of the life and teachings of Jesus.
