Topic: RE – Why does Easter matter to Christians? .

Duration: 6 weeks

What I already know:

In the Autumn term, children will have learnt about Christmas and the why it matters to Christians. This includes how Christians get ready for Christmas, why they give gifts, what was so special about the baby Jesus, why Jesus was like a light, and what Advent is.

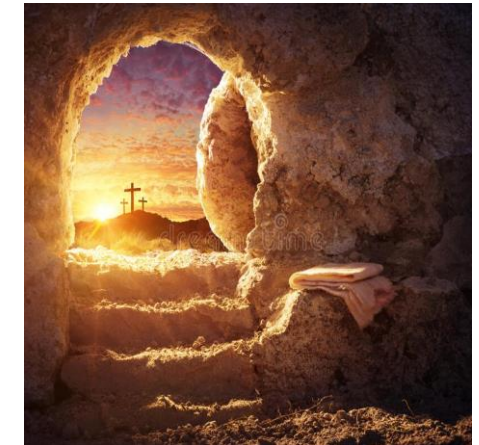
Word	Meaning
Christian	Someone who believes in Christ and his teachings.
Bible	The Christian Holy book containing Christian writing, consisting of the Old and New testaments.
Easter	Celebrates the resurrection of Jesus three days after he was executed.
Church	A holy building for Christians.
Holy Week	The week leading up to Easter
Lent	Lent is a period of time before Easter, where people traditionally give up something. This commemorates Jesus going into the desert to fast and pray.
Shrove Tuesday	This is pancake day, and makes the start of Lent. People traditionally make pancakes because this uses up the eggs, flour and milk in the house before they fast.
Ash Wednesday	Many Christians have a special service in church, where ashes are marked on their forehead in the shape of a cross. This is a sign of saying sorry to God.
Hosanna	The Hebrew word meaning 'save'.
Salvation	Salvation is the act of keeping evil away.
Last Supper	This was on Maundy Thursday and is when Jesus ate the Passover meal with his disciples.
Good Friday	This is the Friday before Easter and commemorates the execution of Jesus through crucifixion.
Palm Sunday	The Sunday before Easter. Celebrates Jesus arriving in Jerusalem riding on a donkey. People greeted him and lay palm branches on the road in front of him.
Sin	An act that is against God's will and morally wrong.
